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Lego Social Club Begins in January





Lego Social Club for this semester ended November 17. The kids finished their Lego sets and enjoyed a pizza party! Lego Social Club will begin again in January in both Charleston and Effingham locations. Lego Social Club is for kids ages 6-13. It is a collaborative play group in which the children work together in groups of three to build Lego sets. Each child has a specific role and is dependent upon the others in the group making social interaction necessary. The children learn skills such as joint attention, sharing, turn-taking, fair division of labor, eye-contact, gaze-following, and verbal and nonverbal communication. Lego Social Club provides natural opportunities to practice social communication, problem-solving and conflict resolution. Children with autism spectrum disorder, other social communication difficulties, anxiety disorders and ADHD could benefit from Lego Social Club.

The cost for Lego Social Club is \$50 for the six-week session. Scholarships may be available for families who qualify. Register early as space is limited. Registration does not guarantee a space. 

Do you have a child that refuses foods or acts out at mealtimes? Do you worry about your child's nutrition? Are you worried that there might be a hidden medical issue causing your child's pickiness? Food Chaining initially developed by co-author Cheri Fraker, as she was treating an child who ate only peanut butter, bread, and milk. The book focuses on The relationship between foods in regard to taste, temperature, and texture. This treatment approach shows you how to help your child enjoy new and nutritious foods regardless of his pickiness and will provide you with a 6-step plan to stop picky eating, solve feeding problems, and expand your child's diet (Cheri Fraker, M.
